22 23	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
24	act may be cited as the "Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect Temporary Amendment Act of
25	2009".
26	Sec. 2. Paragraph (3) of Section 102 of the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect Act
27	of 1977, effective September 23, 1977 (D.C. Law 2-22; D.C. Official Code § 4-1301.02), is
28	amended as follow:
29	(a) A new Subparagraph (F) is added to read as follows:
30	"(F) In the case of a child with respect to whom the permanency plan is placement
31	with a relative and receipt of kinship guardianship assistance payments under section 16-2399 of
32	the District of Columbia Official Code, a description of:
33	"(i) the steps taken to determine that it is not appropriate for the child to

1	be returned home or adopted;
2	"(ii) the reasons for any separation of siblings during placement;
3	"(iii) the reasons why a permanent placement with a fit and willing
4	relative through a kinship guardianship assistance arrangement is in the child's best interests;
5	"(iv) the ways in which the child meets the eligibility requirements for a
6	kinship guardianship assistance payment;
7	"(v) the efforts made to discuss adoption by the child's relative foster
8	parent as a more permanent alternative to legal guardianship and, in the case of a relative foster
9	parent who has chosen not to pursue adoption, documentation of the reasons therefore; and
10	"(vi) the efforts made to discuss with the child's parent or parents the
11	kinship guardianship assistance arrangement, or the reasons why the efforts were not made.".
12	(b) A new subparagraph (G) is added to read as follows:
13	"(G) A plan for ensuring the educational stability of the child while in foster care,
14	including:
15	"(i) assurances that the placement of the child in foster care takes into
16	account the appropriateness of the current educational setting and the proximity to the school in
17	which the child is enrolled at the time of placement; and
18	"(ii) (I) an assurance that the Agency has coordinated with appropriate
19	local educational agencies (as defined under section 9101 of Elementary and Secondary
20	Education Act of 1965 approved April 11, 1965 (79 Stat. 27, 57; 20 USC § 7801)) to ensure that
21	the child remains in the school in which the child is enrolled at the time of placement; or
22	"(II) if remaining in such school is not in the best interests of the child,
23	assurances by the Agency and the local educational agencies to provide immediate and
24	appropriate enrollment in a new school, with all of the educational records of the child provided
25	to the school.".
